The Teacher Center will be sponsoring a series of provocative workshops on Sustainability in all subject areas. These workshops conducted by CELF (Children's Environmental Literacy Foundation) are being offered at no charge to our consortium members. These workshops will address how economic, environmental, and social well being are linked and how to apply this knowledge to better our communities. Each of these workshops will build upon the previous one and participants will see examples of how schools and teachers have integrated sustainability into instruction without adding to the curriculum and learn core approaches.

Workshop #1: Introductory Presentation (Katie Ginsberg - Executive Director, CELF)

An overview of the most pressing economic, environmental and social issues and how different sectors of society - businesses: higher education; K-12; and government - are approaching sustainability.

Workshop #2: Sustainability Education (SE) as a Curriculum Framework

In this session we will review specific things teachers can do to look at topics/curricula/resources that will help to achieve SE goals/outcomes. There will also be an introduction to Ecological Footprint.

Workshop #3: Curricular Connections (Katie Ginsberg & Scott Beall - Instructors)

Teachers will explore opportunities for integrating concepts of environmental sustainability into existing curriculum. This session will look at sustainability's relevance to primary, middle and high school curriculum.
